Dear Alumni,

Hello again! Has another year really gone by? Well, it must have since I had a birthday last week that I couldn't skip. I tried to by taking a vacation day but it still happened. How old? Well, thanks for asking. I'm finally half way to something -- retirement? I hope it's only half my life or less. A one year old in the house keeps me feeling young, and unfortunately father away from retirement. Our oldest turned 21 in February, so I also felt the strain of feeling old. At 45 I'm in my twentieth year in the education profession and 20 more to go.... hopefully.

Here at the school we also have the young and the old. Our oldest building - the middle school - has a fresh look since the completion of the renovation in 2003. Many of you that will be back this summer and remember

it as the "school" will see the same old building from the outside and mostly the same on the inside but with a fresh look. Our newest building - the high school - is in the most need of repair. The building was constructed in 1992 and underwent a roof repair in 2000. Unfortunately leaking has still caused extensive damage. The good news is that we received a special allocation from Impact Aid for \$992,000 to repair the building. Only two schools in the nation received grants. Essentially from the ceiling tiles on up will be completely taken off and a new roof will be built. Much of the interior will be renovated as well including new carpeting, floor tile, paint, and even air conditioning. Yes, air conditioning. We have been trying to put aside enough money to install air conditioning but this way it will get done within the scope of this project. In the planning stages now is to see if we can afford to install air conditioning in the middle school and north wing of the elementary so that all our facilities K-12 are climate controlled. I believe this roof project will be a solution to the drought we have had. As soon as the construction starts and the old roof is taken off it will rain like crazy!!!

No Child Left Behind (or as I like to call it; New York and Cardinals Lose to Boston) continues to be the driving force of our academic curriculum. this year marks the third year of the Dakota STEP testing. We have made significant progress in math and reading but we also know that we have to continue to improve to meet the rigorous requirements of the NCLB. I am very please with how our staff has accepted the challenge of improving the achievement of our students. Two new programs that we implemented were Accelerated Math and Accelerated Reading. Both programs are computer based curriculum that challenges students at their current ability level. The programs are dsigned to improve students' skill level whether it's to get them up to the current grade level expectations or to advance them beyond their current grade level of skill. Another area of NCLB that has had a positive affect on our school is the reqirment to improve teacher quality. By the end of the 2005-06 school year all teachers must meet "highly qualified" status. We have focused our professional development efforts on improving classroom instruction. In other words, if we send a teacher to a workshop we want to make sure it's a worthwhile endeavor that will have a direct affect on classroom instruction. One such example is that we recently had a day of teacher in-service at our school where we brought in trainers from the Accelerated Math and Accelerated Reading company. The next day the teachers that had used the programs were using the techniques and strategies that they learned. Also, the teachers that have not used it were very interested in getting the program. As a result we are planning to expand the uses of the programs for next year.

Last spring I researched how long some of our staff members have been employed with the district. In May at our Teacher and Staff Appreciation supper those with longstanding employment were recognized with a framed certificate.
