Change is coming! Beginning with the 2010-11 school year WRSchool District will be going to a four day school week. The change was approved by the Board of Education in March of last year with this year being used as planning year. The board felt that having a year ahead to make plans gives families more time to make the adjustment. A calendar committee is putting together a recommendation to be presented to the board at the March meeting. The administrators are working on a plan for Friday tutoring and in-service activities for the 2010-11. A grant application has been submitted for a 21st Century After School program, which would be on Friday's.

I may have to correct myself, maybe the biggest news isn't the school calendar. The volleyball team won the Lakota Nations Invitational and placed 4th at this year's state tournament. Our boys' basketball team is having another outstanding season and is entering tournament play hoping to make their fifth consecutive state tournament appearance. This year's team won the Jones County Tournament (also for the fifth year in a row), and the Lakota Nations Invitational. The girls basketball team is headed to the region championship game and hoping to make it's first state tournament appearance since 1992. The girls won the Southern Plains tournament and are the Western Great Plains conference champions. I would like to take this opportunity to commend our students, parents, fans, and alumni for showing their pride in our community.

One of the best success stories of the year is one that we should all be very proud of. The WRHS Quiz Bowl Team won the academic competition at the Lakota Nations Invitational for the second year in a row and several students won individual academic testing contests!!!

With all the challenges that we face in education today and with the state of the economy it is uplifting to see some positives things happening in our school. If you ever get a chance, come take a walk through our hallways and see all the good things that go on during the school day. There are many things that students do in school that don't get the recognition that teams on the playing field get. I feel we have a very dedicated staff that is willing to do what it takes to help students succeed.

During my high school years, I liked Miss Valley as an instructor with all the declamatory contests and plays. Especially when we were practicing the plays and some of the play characters were practicing wrestling in the same room!

The school had a senior "sneak trip" each year in the spring. It was a secret from all the other classes. Our senior class of twenty one students took a trip to the Black Hills. We stayed in Hodges Cabins in Rapid City. Our trip through the Hills was a real treat as most of us had not been there before. Do you remember the goats pulling the wagon? We took a ride on their route through the Hills. FUN!!

The old school building where we started is long gone, but not forgotten. Everyone is happy that there is now a school with updated technology. See you in 2011 if the Lord keeps me around

Bert Banek's recollections of High School

My favorite teacher was the Superintendent Mr. Peterson. I would visit with him in his office, he was a friendly man.

Some of my classmates were the Voss Brothers, Ed Petranek and his wife Martha, Jo Stromer, and Wenonia Swan.

Football was introduced to the school as a sport while I was in High School. All we knew about the game was the ball was supposed to be kicked! You can imagine what it was like to coach a team that had to learn everything. Our football field was just a regular pasture. We wore very little padding and had leather football helmets, so when we were tackled and landed on a rock, it hurt!

Completing High School in White River allowed me to attend South Dakota State College in Brookings. After taking time out from college to fight in WW II, I graduated with an agricultural degree.


I purchased a farm in Kimball, raised six children, and made a good life. I am 91 years old and still live in Kimball.
